Procedures & Training Guidelines for High Tie Blackjack™

PLAYING THE GAME

High Tie Blackjack is a traditional blackjack game with an attractive bonus bet option. Players may place the bonus bet in accordance with the posted table minimums and maximums. One version of the bonus-bet option may be dealt from a shoe using a single deck, double deck, or four (4), six (6), or eight (8) decks. The player is wagering that his first two (2) cards will either form a Blackjack, a suited Blackjack, a pair, suited pair, or that both the dealer and player have Blackjacks, which is called a High Tie. In the case of one and two deck games, the bonus bet also pays for two suited cards. Once the bonus wagers have been settled, the dealer continues dealing normal Blackjack where all house rules apply. A second version of the bonus-bet option is dealt from a four (4), six (6), or eight (8) deck shoe and combines the player's first card and the dealer's first card to give players three additional ways to win at blackjack. For this option, the following payouts apply: 5 to 1 for either a tie or blackjack and 16 to 1 for matching the dealer. To obtain a tie with the dealer the player's first card must be the same as the dealer's first card (rank only). The blackjack would occur when a combination of the player's first card and dealer's first card produced a natural blackjack. Finally, if the player's first card matches the dealer's first card in both rank and suit, the player receives a payout of 16 to 1. Again, once all bonus wagers have been settled, the Dealer continues dealing normal Blackjack where all house rules apply.

High Tie Blackjack is a standard house-banked blackjack with an optional bonus wager. All rules pertaining to standard blackjack as posted on the WSGC's website remain the same except as described specifically in these rules of play.

BETTING FOR THE DEALER

Management at each casino will make the determination on bets for the dealer.

HOW THE GAME IS DEALT

The dealer will shuffle the deck(s) using the appropriate house procedure. The shuffled cards are then placed into a shoe. The dealer deals Blackjack in the normal house fashion. Once all cards are dealt, the dealer settles any bonus bet wagers using the posted pay table. The dealer first collects all losing bonus bets, then goes back and pays any winning bonus bets. When all bonus wagers are settled the dealer will continue the game as any standard blackjack game.

PHYSICAL CHARACTERISTICS OF THE TABLE AND EQUIPMENT

The High Tie Blackjack table is a semi-circle playing surface. The table includes:

- A padded rail attached to the circular outer edge of the table.
- A felt playing surface (containing miscellaneous logos) and having six betting positions with a bonus wager circle at the upper right of each betting position.
- A chip rack (with clear security cover) located on the straight edge of the table.
- A playing card discard holder.

- A table limit sign.
- A dealer tip box (optional)
- A dealing shoe

BONUS WAGER PAYOUTS FOR HIGH TIE BLACKJACK: DEFINITION

VERSION 1

- a) "High Tie" To obtain a High Tie both the dealer and the player must have Blackjack.
- b) "Suited Blackjack" A Suited Blackjack would occur when the player's first two cards are a natural blackjack of the same suit (i.e. Ace of Hearts and Queen of Hearts).
- c) "Suited Pair" A Suited Pair would occur when the player's first two cards are equal in both rank and suit (i.e. Queen of Hearts and Queen of Hearts).
- d) "Unsuited Blackjack" An Unsuited Blackjack would occur when the player's first two cards are a natural blackjack (i.e. Ace of Hearts and Jack of Spades).
- e) "Unsuited Pair" An Unsuited Pair would occur when the player's first two cards are equal in rank only (i.e. 8 of Clubs and 8 of Hearts).
- **f) "Two Suited Cards"** Two Suited Cards would occur when the player's first two cards are equal in suit only (i.e. Queen of Hearts and 3 of Hearts). This payout is only used in single and double deck games.

VERSION 2

- a) "Tie" To obtain a tie with the dealer the player's first card must be the same as the dealer's first card (rank only), i.e. Jack of Hears and Jack of Spades. This bonus wager pays five (5) to one (1).
- b) "Blackjack" A Blackjack would occur when a combination of the player's first card and dealer's first card produced a natural blackjack. This bonus wager pays five (5) to one (1).
- c) "Match" A Match would occur if the player's first card matched the dealer's first card in both rank and suit, i.e. Queen of Hearts and Queen of Hearts. This bonus wager pays sixteen (16) to one (1).

VERSION 3 – See Paytable

WAGERS

- a) All wagers at High Tie Blackjack are made with gaming chips.
- b) The casino establishes the betting limits for all wagers.
- c) Depending on which version is in play, the dealer either compares the player's first two (2) cards to determine if a bonus wager is a winner or loser (Version 1) or the dealer compares his first card with that of each layer to determine if a bonus wager is a winner or loser (Version 2).
- d) Only players who are seated at a High Tie Blackjack table may wager at the game. Once a player has placed a wager and received cards, the player will remain seated until the completion of

that round of play. (Card room operators must not allow wagering limits to exceed the authorized limits set out in WAC 230-15-040 and WAC 230-15-140).		

PROCEDURES FOR COMPLETION FOR A ROUND OF PLAY

- a) Each player that bets at High Tie Blackjack will be responsible for his own hand. No other persons, other than the player and dealer, may touch the cards of that player. Cards must be kept within the parameters of the table and if full view of the dealer at all times.
- b) For Version 1 the player's first two (2) cards constitute the cards to use for settlement. Bets are taken or paid accordingly. Winning bets to be paid and pushed out the circle. For Version 2 the player's first card constitutes the card to use for settlement. Bets are taken or paid accordingly. Winning bets to be paid and pushed out of the circle. For Version 3, see paytable.
- c) When all bonus wagers are settled, the dealer continues to deal a standard blackjack round and bets are taken or paid accordingly.
- d) All cards are picked up, placed in the discard rack, and bets are placed for the next hand.
